One night, the terror took over. I felt as if my sanity was actually slipping away. Fortunately, a steady friend of mine dropped by. “This experience is something that will help you,” she said, and it was this statement that helped keep me from going over the edge that night.

Over the next couple of days I went to see a counselor, who asked, “What about the spiritual part of you?” I had never considered this question before, never asked myself anything about the purpose of my life (or life in general), but as soon as he spoke the words I found myself in a vastly changed experience of life. It wasn’t a hallucination. I was in a bigger, brighter, enormously spacious world. I could see all the colors of the rainbow in every speck of light in the room. Also, before me, a gold cord about four inches in diameter extended infinitely up and down.

And then a voice—not the therapist’s—spoke. “Grab the cord,” it said.



It was a big voice.

(It was my own inner voice. But I didn't know that then; I just reached.) And as soon as I grabbed the cord, I was filled with new knowledge. I knew, without a doubt, that my life was about learning, the biggest kind of learning. I had shifted into a higher level of consciousness that included another "mind" located deep in my chest. The voice in this mind said "I want to love All." And this became my touchstone. No matter what action or decision lay before me, I asked myself this question: Will it help me love All? If it would, I'd do it. If not, not.

This essential direction brought me back to earth and gave me a real life. Since I had grown up skeptical of everything, I was drawn to only the most powerful experiences: stuff that wasn't in any of the books; stuff that really worked, and worked fast. I learned how to get grounded... what it meant to have a body... how I could use my thinking mind more clearly. And I knew that, if it had helped me—with my extreme need and condition—then this learning could surely help others, too.

So I began teaching. I'm not an intellectual or a new-age guru. I didn't want to talk about consciousness. I wanted to help people experience and change from their conditioned way of being to something much bigger.
